

Presumed Benefit Clientele: Income documentation is not required if the service/project is provided exclusively for a clientele that fits one of the “presumed” categories; i.e., abused children, elderly persons, battered spouses, homeless persons, adults who are severely disabled persons (as defined by Census), illiterate adults, persons living with AIDS, and migrant farm workers. HUD presumes that at least 51% of the people who fall into one of these categories are low/mod.

If an activity is limited to assisting one or more of the presumptive benefit groups, report the number of persons benefiting from the services your agency provides, under the following income categories unless you have information that supports reporting them under a different income category:

<u>Group</u>	<u>Income Level</u>
Abused children	Extremely low income (30% of AMI)
Battered spouses	Very Low income (50% of AMI)
Severely disabled adults	Very Low income
Homeless persons	Extremely low income
Illiterate adults	Very Low income
Persons with AIDS	Very Low income
Migrant farm workers	Very Low income
Elderly	Very Low income

Anyone not falling into any of the above categories should prove or self-certify that they are at least Low Income (80% or less of AMI).
